you take away the sins of the world,  
have mercy on us;  
you take away the sins of the world,  
receive our prayer;  
you are seated at the right hand of the Father,  
have mercy on us.  
For you alone are the Holy One,  
You alone are the Lord,  
you alone are the Most High,  
Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit,

### **LITURGY OF THE WORD**

#### **First Reading:** Ecclesiasticus (24:1-2,8-12)

*The wisdom of God has pitched her tent  
among the chosen people.*

Wisdom speaks her own praises, in the midst of her people she glories in herself. She opens her mouth in the assembly of the Most High, she glories in herself in the presence of the Mighty One;

'Then the creator of all things instructed me, and he who created me fixed a place for my tent. He said, "Pitch your tent in Jacob, make Israel your inheritance. "From eternity, in the beginning, he created me, and for eternity I shall remain. I ministered before him in the holy tabernacle, and thus was I established on Zion.

In the beloved city he has given me rest, and in Jerusalem I wield my authority. I have taken root in a privileged people, in the Lord's property, in his inheritance.'

#### **Responsorial Psalm:** (Ps 147:12-15, 19-20. R. Jn.1:14)

#### **R. The Word was made flesh, and lived among us.**

O praise the Lord, Jerusalem!  
Zion, praise your God!  
He has strengthened the bars of your gates  
he has blessed the children within you. **R**

He established peace on your borders,  
he feeds you with finest wheat.  
He sends out his word to the earth  
and swiftly runs his command. **R**

He makes his word known to Jacob,  
to Israel his laws and decrees.  
He has not dealt thus with other nations;  
he has not taught them his decrees. **R**

#### **Second Reading:** Ephesians (1:3-6, 15-18)

*He determined that we should become  
his adopted sons through Jesus.*

Blessed be God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with all the spiritual blessings of heaven in Christ. Before the world was made, he chose us, chose us in Christ, to be holy and spotless, and to live through love in his presence, determining that we should become his adopted sons, through Jesus Christ for his own kind purposes, to make us praise the glory of his grace, his free gift to us in the Beloved.

That will explain why I, having once heard about your faith in the Lord Jesus, and the love that you show towards all the saints, have never failed to remember you in my prayers and to thank God for you. May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, give you a spirit of wisdom and perception of what is revealed, to bring you to full knowledge of him. May he enlighten the eyes of your mind so that you can see what hope his call holds for you, what rich glories he has promised the saints will inherit.

#### **Gospel Acclamation:** (Cf. 1 Tim 3:16)

**Alleluia, alleluia! Glory be to you, O Christ,  
proclaimed to the pagans; Glory be to you, O  
Christ, believed in by the world. Alleluia!**

**Gospel: John** (1:1-5, 9-14)

*The Word was made flesh, and lived among us.*

In the beginning was the Word:  
and the Word was with God  
and the Word was God.  
He was with God in the beginning.  
Through him all things came to be,  
not one thing had its being but through him.  
All that came to be had life in him  
and that life was the light of men,  
a light that shines in the dark,  
a light that darkness could not overpower.

The Word was the true light  
that enlightens all men;  
and he was coming into the world.  
He was in the world  
that had its being through him,  
and the world did not know him.  
He came to his own domain  
and his own people did not accept him.  
But to all who did accept him  
he gave power to become children of God,  
to all who believe in the name of him  
who was born not out of human stock  
or urge of the flesh  
or will of man  
but of God himself.

The Word was made flesh,  
he lived among us,  
and we saw his glory,  
the glory that is his as the only Son of the Father,  
full of grace and truth.

he came down from heaven, (**please bow**)  
*and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the  
Virgin Mary, and became man.*

For our sake  
he was crucified under Pontius Pilate,  
he suffered death and was buried,

in accordance with the Scriptures.  
He ascended into heaven  
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again in glory  
to judge the living and the dead

\* **Science and Faith events from Radio Maria England taking place at Our Lady of the Assumption and the English Martyrs (OLEM) in Cambridge**:

The speakers will be Prof Robert Turner and Dr Mihnea Turcanu. Prof Robert Turner is a British neuroscientist, physicist, and social anthropologist. He has been a director and professor at the Max Planck Institute for Human Cognitive and Brain Sciences in Leipzig, Germany, and is an internationally recognized

expert in brain physics and magnetic resonance imaging (MRI). Dr Mihnea Turcanu pursued a PhD in biomedical engineering at the University of Glasgow where he specialized in ultrasound-mediated targeted drug delivery technology. He is currently a research associate at the university of Leuven, Belgium where he has been using AI technology to enhance ultrasound imaging that is used in radiotherapy cancer treatments.

Helena Judd from RME said: "The event is ideal for people of ages, but especially young people that have continually heard that you must keep science and faith separate."

The event can be attended in sections or in its entirety. The first one will be on 8<sup>th</sup> January 2022:

\* **CAFOD Appeal**: Typhoon Rai, described as one of the world's strongest storms of 2021, made landfall in the Philippines on 16 December, causing widespread damage. Over 375 people lost their lives, and hundreds of thousands of people were evacuated from their homes. The typhoon's strong winds and storm surges brought down trees, power lines and destroyed homes, schools and hospitals. Consequently, thousands of people could not celebrate Christmas, and are facing months or even years of hardship by the natural disasters on top of the COVID pandemic.
